

Central Florida Blues Challenge Winners:

The Selwyn Birchwood Band (2009)



In this series you will be introduced to the past and present Central Florida Blues Challenge winners.

Selwyn Birchwood Band received top honors at the 2013 International Blues Challenge coming in 1st place out of over 230 bands from around the world!

Selwyn also received the "Albert King Award" for best guitarist!! IBC- K Stott

Your band had won the International Blues Challenge 2013. How many times did you compete in the IBC and what blues societies sent you?

Selwyn: I competed 3 times. <u>2009 Orange Blossom</u> <u>Blues Society</u>, 2012 Suncoast Blues Society, 2013 Suncoast Blues Society





How did you prepare for the competitions? What do you think the judges look for at the IBC?

Selwyn: I didn't really do too much out of the ordinary from our usual shows. You have to make sure that you're obviously well-rehearsed. The only thing that we had to consciously work out was the time requirement. So, we made sure to rehearse the actual songs that we were going to perform at IBC against a timer to ensure we were within the limits.

What did the band enjoy most about the International Blues Competitions in Memphis?

Selwyn: The sheer number of bands and amount of music is what is best about the IBC. You get to hear so many different bands and meet so many people from around the world that all love Blues



How are you involved in the Suncoast Blues Society?

Selwyn: I support the events and shows that they put on and promote and they do the same for my band's shows.



What is your performance schedule? Any cds or upcoming performances?

Selwyn: I keep all of my tour dates updated on my website (selwynbirchwood.com). We just finished recording our 3rd CD which will be released this summer! :oD I have 12 new original tunes on this upcoming record.




Who did you previously tour with?



George Linson Stage Comes Alive Again With Kim Simmonds and Savoy Brown

Since the closing of McWell's just a few short months ago, the George Linson Stage was alive and well again on Saturday, February 15th 2014. Thanks to the tireless efforts of Zaida Zoller, of ZShowz Alive Entertainment, and the new Friendly Confines, Central Florida blues fans were treated to a rockin' good time. What better way to celebrate the return



of a venue to the Central Florida blues scene then to have a blues-rock legend remind us that if your foundation is strong, the house will continue to stand and weather the

test of time?



Savoy Brown is one of the longest continuously running blues-rock bands in the world today. Founded by guitarist Kim Simmonds in 1965, Savoy Brown not only led the British blues movement of the late sixties, but they continue to record, tour, and deliver power packed shows. Backed by Pat DeSalvo on bass and Garnet Grimm on drums, Kim Simmonds took the audience for a blues journey 50 years in the making. After opening with *A Hard Way To Go*, the band

proceed through past gems including *Black Night*, off of their first album Shake Down.

released in 1967. After which, Kim apologized for "getting into such deep blues so early in the night." Of course, the standing room only crowd roared with approval and demanded more.

The band then performed several new tunes from their new *Going To the Delta* release and showed why early reviews are so positive. The new tunes embrace the history and roots of Mississippi Delta blues while providing Kim and the band with a boost of energy. Like kids breaking in new bikes on Christmas morning, the mates were all smiles as they took the new songs out for a spin, much to the audience's enjoyment. And, the "old school" fans in the crowd were not disappointed as the journey came full circle with hits including *Hellbound Train*, Muddy Water's *Louisiana*



Blues, Tell Mama, and a rousting encore performance of The Savoy Brown Boogie!

Seeing Kim Simmonds "act like a kid again" reminds us that there is nothing like a live blues show to keep us feeling young and alive. Savoy Brown reassured us that the foundation is strong, the house is still rockin' and it is freshly painted blue!





Preserve Promote and Present the Blues

The Gary Ingber Memorial Fund was created by the Orange Blossom Blues Society in April 2008 in honor of our dear friend, Gary Ingber, who passed away in February 2008. The mission of the fund is to offer modest financial aide in a timely and practical manner to any deserving area musician (or their immediate survivors.). The range of assistance is from \$100 - \$500 and the types of assistance that will be considered are medical, prescriptions due to illness, accident, emergency needs and burial/final expenses.



The fund is available to active, professional musicians (or an immediate survivor) in the Central Florida area. A recipient does not have to be an OBBS member to receive funds, but requests for assistance must come from an OBBS member. Assistance is limited to one application per person each six months, or a one-time request for funeral expenses. Please click on the below email link to email the board for further details.
